

again supposed to attend the Haarlem Jamborette with Sam and Rowan as their leaders. Sadly, Sam experienced kidney failure just weeks before he was supposed to attend. In between dialysis treatments he flew over and still attended the Jamborette for three days! Sam was also in his last year at university and spent a lot of time writing when sitting around getting dialysis.

After lots and lots of testing to be able to find a suitable match for a transplant, there finally was one! It took a little over 6 months, but this is where the real scouting spirit showed: Rowan's mom was the one who matched for the transplant! Exactly one year ago in July of 2022, Sam got his new kidney and now he is here for the whole Jamborette as a troop leader.



Two other very special people are here as leaders: Sam's parents. A couple of days ago you could have seen that the paraboloid was placed into the lake. Sam's parents were there when they were building the paraboloid to take notes. This on request of the happy couple, because of something very special that happened in 2022: the two got engaged! The wedding is happening

BRIDGING THE RED RIVER

When walking through Subcamp Red, you can't miss the massive bridge over the water. The bridge was built by subcamp staff member Frits. He explained that this is the third edition of the bridge, in 2015 the staff thought it would be a good idea to build a bridge over the dam that is present there. It is essentially a shortcut between the camp staff and the rest of

the camp, as otherwise you have to walk around the water. Frits gets help every year from his friends from "Bosbeheer Sprookjesbos" from his group Scouting Assendelft. They spent three days total building the bridge, making sure it was finished by the time the participants arrived. The bridge has a double function, it also functions as the flag mast of the subcamp: every day the flags are raised above the bridge by a different group, and in the evening they are lowered again. The bridge is a popular attraction in subcamp Red, so

definitely check it out when it is open during the day!











TRY IT YOURSELF: DUTCH FAST FOOD!

Dutch people really like their own fast food snacks once in a while: a frikandel, kroket or kaassoufflé. Hearty and hot from the fryer and any sauce will make it even better. Or, in the case of the kroket, mustard. A deep (fry) dive in these famous Dutch snacks.

You might know the kroket from other European countries. Like

'croquetas' in Spain! In the Netherlands they are usually filled with a beefy or veggie ragout. The outside is made from breadcrumbs. Feltham scout Isabella says: "It's actually quite nice! Not so sure what it is but it tastes good!".

Jack from 108th Pentland
confirms it's gooey on the inside
and crispy on the outside.

Tip: try a kroket on a white bun
with some mustard. The Dutch
love it as a Friday afternoon
snack.

Kaassouffles, cheese soufflés, are a true hit during this Jamborette!

It's a kind of dough with a piece of cheese inside. "It's really good, crispy on the outside, silky and smooth on the inside," says Tanveer from London Lions GLMW. Eitana from Israel Scouts also tasted a piece of a kaassoufflé and thinks it's a good snack to try. But be careful: when you think it has cooled down just enough to take a bite, wait a little bit longer. The cheese inside is very hot!

The frikandel is the most sold snack in the Netherlands. It is minced meat with

herbs and spices in a sausagelike shape. Usually eaten with a lot of mayonnaise and ketchup or curry. The Dutch even like to add raw white onion on top! Bea of Hemel Hempstead tried it: "it's sausagey and meaty and it is flavoursome. It isn't that rubbish like normal sausages!". Now you know what to do: run to the Komeet and try them yourself!
