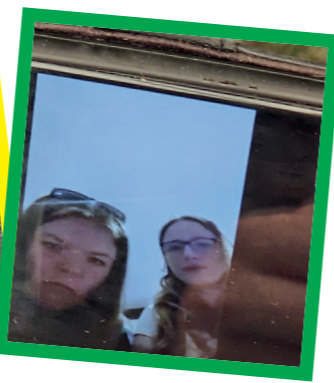

Leona and Sophie's Jamboree didn't fully go according to plan due to extreme weather, which means that they have been staying in a hotel for the last week. The hotel is very luxury, which is a big switch from the campsite at which they had been staying. For a while it was unsure whether the English scouts would be staying in Korea or would be travelling home. If they would have flown home, their leaders present here at the Jamborette had already invited them to come here instead of going home immediately. Luckily for Leona and Sophie, they were able to stay in Korea and continue their



Jamboree. The girls in Korea have done many fun activities over the past weeks, Millie and Izzy explain that their activities are quite similar to the ones they have done here at the Haarlem Jamborette. Where Millie and Izzy visited Haarlem and Amsterdam, their sisters similarly visited Korean cities, all of them learning a lot about the culture in which they have been welcomed. When asked whether Millie and Izzy also wanted to attend the World Scout Jamboree in four years' time, their answers

were a bit different. Both girls think it is cool that the next edition is a bit closer to home, as it will be in Poland in 2027. Izzy thinks it will be so much fun to go, she would be attending as a participant. However, Millie would be too old to go as a participant, so she would have to go as a troop leader or staff member. So Millie is not quite sure yet about if she wants to go. Maybe we will see Millie and Izzy here at the Haarlem Jamborette in four years' time, if not, we wish them a lot of fun in Poland!

Misha from Scouting Holendrecht made new friends with Milton and Falkirk scouts. "They are from Scotland and Canada and we really bonded while we're here."



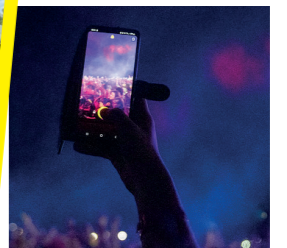

Not all posts on Jamborette are fun and games, Hikes is all about perseverance and competition. All groups had the opportunity to walk different lengths of hikes and the toughest scouts of them all walk the Punisher. Throughout this 40 kilometer long journey, the scouts ventured on all kinds of terrain.

Besides the giant distance that needed to be completed, hikers

did not receive a route to follow. The way to go was a mystery at every turn or crossroad. They solved puzzles to find out which way was the correct one. Wrong direction? No worries. The scouts' location was tracked with an app, to make sure they did not wander off too far. Going the right way got the runners to multiple checkpoints, where they received enough water to keep them hydrated.

The Punisher started at the campsite and led them to harder and harder paths. The scouts were used to hiking on

roads, but having to go across the beach with its sandy dunes, and nature resort with its path-blocking branches made it extremely difficult. Once the scouts survived these trials, they went through Haarlem to take the final sprint back.

The fastest group at the moment are called the 1st Sommerton. Four scouts and a leader completed this hike in 5 hours and 53 minutes. This hardcore group of scouts consist of Henry, Ben,

Rowan and George. This time might be fast, but the runners-up came really close to beating this time. With some groups still doing the hike later, this group can only hope to stay on top.

things about. Heather and Brad agreed, the group gave permission, and the adventure began!

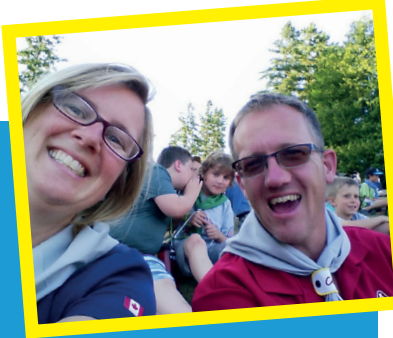

HAJA [haa-jaa]

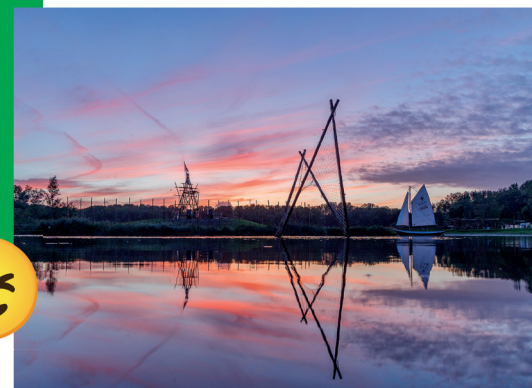
